1. Council consultation with Kylie Huard (Moreland Council)

1.a. Merri Creek path widening: Moreland Rd & Brunswick velodrome

- · Reviewed proposed realignment of the path along Harrison St
- Some impact on Brunswick Cycling Club (removal of old gate building)
- Proposed to remove the old cyclone fencing between the new bike path and the bike shed
- Width: 3 metres

1.b. Merri Creek path widening: Parkview to CERES

- Pave the existing dirt track that shortcuts the curved bike path
- · Land is owned by Melbourne Water
- Both paths (old & new) would be shared paths
- Width: 3 metres

1.c. Sumner Park

- Unresolved issues on connecting Alister St to the Merri Creek bike path through the park.
- All this work is coming out of the cycling budget, even though it is for shared paths there is no "pedestrian" budget

1.d. Moreland Rd / Cameron St intersection

• It's not clear where the bike path goes at the moment

- Pram ramps on the north and south side of Moreland Rd, with a fence on the north side to stop cyclists riding through the car park
- Green treatment not the right use of green treatment
- More signage? Already too cluttered with signs
- To be discussed in the section on the Moreland Station update

1.e. Anstey Station

- Issues with the position of the bus stops and impact on cars queuing across the rail crossing
- Move the stops? Bus companies are happy but some problems with relocating the westbound bus on the east side of the railline
- Remove or move the pram ramp?
- Bus can not stop across a driveway as it would be a step down this applies for both the front and rear doors
- · Lots of discussion & debate, but no resolution yet

1.f. 815 Nicholson St

- The old VideoEzy site
- Tenders gone out
- Cafe at rear, bike shop at front
- Path will be 6 metres wide (not the mooted 9m) compatible with the tram median strip in the middle of Nicholson St
- · Kylie has photos and plan drawings if people are interested in following this up

2. The Moreland Station update

- VicTrack are planning development of the Moreland Station area
- Anna was asked to provide input into the consultation (along with Jason from BV)
- Proposal from VicTrack:
 - Residential development next to the station, on either side of the railline
 - · Keep the gardens on the west side
 - Keep the children's centre on the east side, some green space on this side will go
 - Car park on the east side becomes a car park
 - Realign the bike path, but may not realign the crossing at the Moreland Rd/ Cameron St intersections
- We want path improvements, lighting upgrades
- VicTrack are currently rewriting request for tender; will eventually go to Council for planning applications
- We have a lot of time to provide input before a developer will be selected
- There will be a "stakeholder representative" group set up, with BUG representation if people are passionate about the issue, they can join the group
- VicTrack will also be developing on their land south of Moreland Rd (between the rail line and Cameron St)

3. O'Hea St update

• Update from Paul McKay on the "give way" sign problem + treatment at the railway line (for people heading east)

- There will be a meeting with BUG and Council (Thursday November 6, 4pm) to discuss the issue and develop a solution on the give way signs - if you are interested in attending, let Anna know
- Consensus is that the give way signs should be removed
- · BUG has put a position (in writing) to council on this

4. Local Government elections

- Saturday November 29
- Plan is to organise a meeting with candidates to grill them on their cycling (and sustainable transport) policies
- · Last election, Coburg BUG (Laurie) sent a survey to each candidate

- Biggest expense: insurance (\$836)
- Second largest expense was the bike stands for the Sydney Rd Street Festival (\$200)
- Funds moved to Westpac to eliminate bank fees
- We did not receive a final statement from the Commonwealth Bank
- We need to work on income if we want to maintain ride insurance
